

Reading For Pleasure


Y3 Wimbledon Bookfest-Olaf Falafel




Change Sings Art Gallery Exhibition

IMPORTANT INFORMATION!

Changes to Y1 and Y2 Drop off and Collection

After the October Half term, children in Y1 and Y2 will no longer be entering the school from the school hall. Y2 children will access their classroom next to the school for drop off and also be collected from here also. Similarly with Y1 parents will drop off pupils at the Reception entrance (Mitcham Park gate) and collect from the classroom by walking around the footpath towards the KS2 playground. Unfortunately we have had to make this decision due to safeguarding reasons with parents entering school premises without permission.

Illegal and irresponsible parking

We are constant receiving complaints about inconsiderate and dangerous parking outside the school gates. Examples include parking on pavements, causing obstructions, blocking driveways, parking on double yellow lines, and allowing children to exit vehicles whilst stopped on School Keep Clear 'zig-sags' or in queuing traffic. There have been recent incidences of abusive and threatening behaviour by parents and carers towards law enforcement officers in front of pupils on the way into school. This behaviour and standard of driving and parking are wholly unacceptable and most important put your children's safety at risk. I have requested for there to be a regular parking warden and the police to frequent our school street to avoid this in the future.

If you don't jhave any other options and do need to use a vehicle to drop your child off, then we request that you allow extra time for your journey in order to drop off safely and legally and park further away from the school if you are at all able.
