The Second Sunday of Advent

The Second Sunday of Advent will be on 10th December. The theme is the peace that Christ brought to mankind with his birth and incarnation. The peace candle reminds us that the angels declared "peace on earth" at the birth of Jesus. Jesus offers us inner peace and peace with others. We can know and experience peace today only through the life of Jesus Christ.

What does Peace really mean?

Peace is one of those words that people often use, but they don't always explain it very well. Depending on which religion or philosophy that people follow, their definitions of peace may be highly different.

In Hebrew, the word for peace is shalom. Throughout the Bible, shalom is used in several ways. When people are feeling physically well, others say that they "are shalom" (Genesis 29:6). People who have shalom with God have his protection and blessing (Numbers 25:12).

There are hints in the Old Testament that shalom with God is to be an inner state that comes from trusting in him (<u>Isaiah 26:3</u>).

Literary Legend Benjamin Zephaniah, Gone Too Soon!

On Thursday, the sad news broke that the novelist, poet, musician and actor, Benjamin Zephaniah had passed away, aged 65.


Benjamin Zephaniah was a truly inspirational person and was never afraid to speak the truth. Our very own Year 6 children will study his superb novel, *Windrush Child* later on this year and thousands of children have heard his poetry in schools up and down the country for years and years. He would often perform his poetry in a style called 'dub', and this brought musicality to his poems and made them feel more alive.

"I feel poetry should be alive. You should be able to dance it." Benjamin Zephaniah

Benjamin was born on April 15, 1958, near Birmingham, England. His parents were from Barbados and Jamaica. As a child, he enjoyed the reggae music and poetry of Jamaica which would influence his work later on. Benjamin was dyslexic and struggled at school but that didn't hold him back- he never gave up on his dreams and he started writing poetry when he was very young.

At first, he wrote poetry for adults, but later he realised that children also understood the issues he wrote about. His first book of children's poetry was called Talking Turkeys which featured themes around animal rights and vegetarianism, and was published in 1994. Since then he has written much more for children. In 1999, he also started writing novels for teenagers. His first novel, Face, was about racial discrimination.

Always wanting to speak about real issues and fight for a world full of equality and love, he will be sadly missed.


