#### School Attendance

As you have probably seen, the government have put school attendance on their agenda and are closely monitoring this nationally. Research has shown a link of poor attendance in school to poor academic grades and progress. As a school we monitor all class registers and are legally responsible to inform parents of any low school attendance.

The governments expectations for attendance is 95%. Pupils with 90% of lower attendance are considered as Persistently Absent and they are reminding families that they should not take any holidays in term time holidays.

I'm sure you are aware that it is vital that children attend regularly and are punctual to school. Children who have regular attendance progress steadily and grow in confidence. The children get a positive start to the day and this is often the time when the vital phonic work takes place. Fortunately, as a school our attendance rate is good and I thank you for supporting your children and the school in this matter.



# Catholic life of the school KS1 Church Visit




St Brigid and St Clare classes visited SS


